Where to attend college is the most important decision that young people make. By prioritizing academics, you can ensure that your undergraduate education prepares you for a rewarding career, engaged citizenship, and meaningful community participation.

- How does the university ensure that all students graduate with a strong background in the foundational arts and sciences disciplines?
- What does the university do to foster a serious academic culture on campus?
- What is your four-year graduation rate?
- Over the last five years, what is the average annual rate of tuition increase?
- What concrete steps has the university taken to protect freedom of expression on campus?

- What proportion of courses have fewer than 30 students?
- What is your student-to-faculty ratio, and are professors readily available for one-on-one discussions and to mentor student research?
- Can you recommend a faculty member in my major who I can reach out to regarding program requirements, study abroad, and internships?
- Do students have access to walk-in professional advisors and faculty advisors in their disciplines?
- What are the general education requirements for graduation?
